## Honorary Secretary's 2017 Report

The Holt Shield Committee met twice during 2017/18 and the following business was conducted.

- The resignation of Helen's Bay from the Holt Shield was reluctantly accepted.
- Blackwood Golf Club was welcomed into the Holt Shield maintaining the status quo of 36 clubs.
- The Holt Shield website continues to evolve. During his speech at the presentation dinner at Fortwilliam, Bangor's captain Graham Yarr praised the Holt Shield website as user friendly with a comprehensive content that is continually updated. Thanks to Colin and Darryl who are mainly responsible for the website.
- It was agreed to present for approval at the 2018 AGM a proposed new rule stating that players can only play for one club during the season and a proposed amendment to rule 21.
- New GUI handicap eligibility for the Junior Cup and Jimmy Bruen was discussed and the possible impact, if any this may have on the Holt Shield.
